Our November meeting was a little different this time, as we had an actual guest Speaker via Zoom. We welcomed John Wilson from the Liverpool Seafarers Centre.

He gave a very interesting talk about the centre, which gives a front-line service offering support to 50,000 seafarers passing through the Port of Liverpool each year. LSC's mission remains firmly focused on providing 'a lifeline' to seafarers, offering a safe and secure place to rest and also receive practical and emotional support." Our mission is to promote the spiritual, moral and physical welfare of persons who are, or have been, seafarers and their families" Liverpool's seafarer outreach work dates back to the 19th century through the Anglican Mersey Mission to Seafarers which was founded in 1856. Liverpool Seafarers Centre (LSC) as it is known today is the result of a successful partnership between the Anglican Mersey Mission to Seafarers and the Catholic Apostleship of the Sea. The merger followed in the footsteps of Bishops Worlock and Sheppard and their work for greater unity. The shipping companies have agreed to a voluntary levy from all of them operating in the Port of Liverpool and Manchester Ship Canal to help fund welfare support for all their crew members. John was totally dedicated to his role at organising the centre and staff, and we all recognised it was a vocation for him, and how much he loved helping so many foreign crew members who were a long way from home and out of touch with their families for months on end. We gave a donation towards the Centre, with John confirming it would go towards Christmas presents they provide for crew members each year.

Following this talk, we returned to our business items, although this was not our official AGM that would normally take place in November. In the absence of our normal activities, the committee felt we should give our ladies a small gift to remind them all that we were thinking of them. Every member received a bag containing a jar of homemade jam, a bag with 3 hyacinth bulbs, a quiz and a handwritten card from myself. These were much appreciated by everyone and we received many personal thanks from our ladies.
