St. Mary's Church in Bosley is over 600 years old, it was originally thatched and is the oldest of the churches in the benefice. It has undergone many changes over the years being burnt down, except for the tower, in the 18th century and rebuilt in brick and now we are making another change so it is also a community centre for the whole village as well as a place of worship and it is already becoming popular and is being used by several groups and on 1st October we will be making full use of out lovely new kitchen for our harvest supper. Services in October start with Holy Communion on the 3rd, chapel on the 10th for their harvest, an all ages service on 17th and BCP Holy Communion on the 24th.

Very sadly Sylvia Jenkinson died on 3rd September after a short stay in hospital. She was the heart of the village and will be sadly missed by all in Bosley. Her funeral is on 6th October at noon.

The staging post at Bosley church for the Climate Challenge served refreshments and participants were able to choose a menu and with the information and package on show see how many food miles were used. This proved quite popular and there was a lot of information on display and also paintings on the theme of climate change. Many walked down to Chapel or came from elsewhere.

The alpaca picnic fest was very popular with classic cars on show and other activities and made £3,500 for the hospice.
