Our further plans to enable the building to be used more as a Community Hall for the village include changes to the seating, flooring and new radiators. We shall also be investing in some projection and sound equipment to enhance the services and activities.

We now have several groups using the church for their weekly or monthly activities including Pilates, Crafts & Spinning, together with the Primary School having better access for their use too. Recent one-off events have also been held in the church now that we have the space and facilities to do so; a Harvest Supper & Auction and a Luncheon for COP26 visitors.
